

FEDERAL FUNDS AT WORK IN HAMILTON COUNTY SCHOOLS

2020-2021

Title I, A (Basic): Provides federal funding based on district poverty level used to focus on improving instruction in order to increase student achievement. Supplemental services and materials are provided to students in the areas of reading, mathematics, writing and science. Title I funds are provided for assistance to instructional staff in becoming highly qualified and promote student engagement. Title I funds are supplemental to state and local funds. Title I funds are used to target students in grades K-12 in the Hamilton School District.

Title I, C (Migrant): Provides assistance to students who are academically challenged due to frequent mobility and lifestyle. The families of these students are also eligible for services.

Title II-A (Supporting Effective Instruction): Assists school districts in preparing, recruiting, training, and retaining high quality teachers, principals and supporting effective instruction.

Title III (English Learners): Provides assistance for the improvement of the education of immigrant and limited English proficient students.

Title IX (Homeless): Provides assistance to students and families who are identified as homeless in the McKinney Vento program.

IDEA, Part B: IDEA, Part B, Preschool; and IDEA, Part B Discretionary Supplement: IDEA Part B and Preschool provides supplemental funds for identified special students. IDEA is also supplemental funding for students with disabilities ages 3 to 21.
