Grade Level:	Subject Area:
K-2 nd Grade	In order to achieve proper implementation and to provide age appropriate instruction, curriculum will be integrated into all K-2 classrooms.
3 rd -5 th Grade	In order to achieve implementation for all students within these grade levels, instruction will be integrated into our Special Area/Personal Fitness courses.
6 th Grade	In order to achieve implementation for all students within this grade level, instruction will be integrated into the 6 th Grade World History course.
7 th Grade	In order to achieve implementation for all students within this grade level, instruction will be integrated into the 7 th Grade Science course.
8 th Grade	In order to achieve implementation for all students within this grade level, instruction will be integrated into the 8 th Grade US History course.
9 th Grade	In order to achieve implementation for all students within this grade level, instruction will be integrated into the 9 th Grade World Geography course.
10 th Grade	In order to achieve implementation for all students within this grade level, instruction will be integrated into the 10 th Grade World History course.
11 th Grade	In order to achieve implementation for all students within this grade level, instruction will be integrated into the 11 th Grade ELA course.
12 th Grade	In order to achieve implementation for all students within this grade level, instruction will be integrated into the 12 th Grade ELA course.

Grades K-2	Using crosswalk lessons provided within our “Safer, Smarter Kids” curriculum, K-2 instructors will arrange age appropriate instruction to include making safe choices, identifying unsafe situations, recognizing the signs of human trafficking, setting healthy boundaries, prevention of substance abuse, safe use of the internet and social media, awareness of resources, and how to safely seek help.
Grades 3-5	Our School Resource Deputies, School Nurse, Guidance Counselors, and Special Area instructors will utilize crosswalk lessons provided within our “Safer, Smarter Kids” curriculum. Age appropriate instruction will include making safe choices, identifying unsafe situations, understanding healthy/unhealthy relationships, recognizing the signs of human trafficking, setting healthy boundaries, prevention of substance abuse, safe use of the internet and social media, awareness of resources, and how to safely seek assistance.
Grades 6-12	Using crosswalk lessons provided within our “Safer, Smarter Teens” curriculum as well as resources at www.fldoe.org , School Resource Deputies and designated instructors will provide age appropriate instruction to include recognizing the signs of human trafficking, developing awareness of resources, preventing substance abuse, reducing the risk of human trafficking, setting healthy boundaries, knowing how to safely report/seek assistance, and understanding how social media and mobile device applications are used for human trafficking.

Data Tracking & Reporting

- I. The Coordinator of Safety and Mental Health, School Safety Specialist, will provide a report to the Commissioner of Education by **July 1st** of each year verifying completion of instruction.

 - a. The specific courses in which instruction was delivered for each grade level.
