

- School personnel are required to be trained in Youth Mental Health First Aid in order to better identify signs and symptoms of potential mental health issues.
- The state has mandated that students in Grades 6-12 are now required to take a 5-hour mental health course by the end of the year.
- The state has also mandated that students in Grades K-12 receive substance use and abuse health education as well as child trafficking prevention by the end of the school year.

- October is National Bullying Prevention Month <u>www.stopbullying.gov</u>
- Bullying is unwanted, aggressive behavior among school aged children that involves a real or perceived power imbalance. The behavior is repeated, or has the potential to be repeated, over time.
 Both kids who are bullied and who bully others may have serious, lasting problems.
